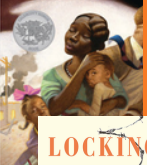

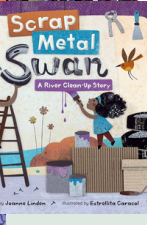

ON THIS DAY



January 23, 1921 The Sachem Literary Society, the first student organization at Sul Ross State University (then called Sul Ross State Normal College), was established on January 23, 1921. The club motto was "As for me, though that my wit be lyte, On bokes for to rede I me delyte" and they studied contemporary (to 1921) short stories with a group of roughly 20 members known as "The Sachems." Other student clubs born in the Spring semester of 1921 include the student orchestra, Glee Club, Rifle Club (the first in the country to include women), and the Big Bend Public Speaking Club for Boys.
