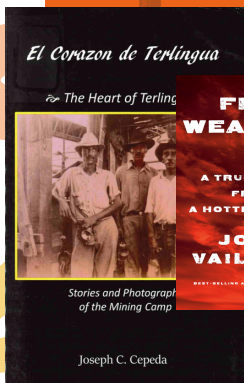

March 2, 1953: "On a blustery March day less than twelve months after Walter Fulcher's death, a line of automobiles traveled through the mountains from Alpine to the ghost town of Terlingua. A detachment from the American Legion post of Alpine conducted a ceremony to perpetuate their regard of Walter Fulcher's place in the slow and intermittent progress of the Big Bend desert villages."
