


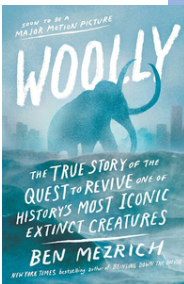
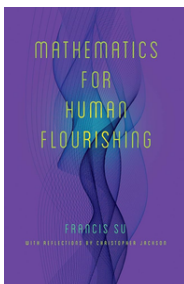

### ON THIS DAY



**September 1969** The new Bryan Wildenthal Memorial Library building officially opened to patrons in September of 1969. Prior to the opening of the new library building, library services for the university were first housed in two rooms of what is now the Briscoe Administration Building and then later relocated to the third floor of the Morelock Academic Building. The original design for the current building, designed by the architectural firm of Jessen, Jessen, Millhouse, Greeven, and Crume, included just two stories. The third floor, which now houses the library's circulating collection, was later added. [Find more Sul Ross history in the Digital Collections of the Archives of the Big Bend.](#)
