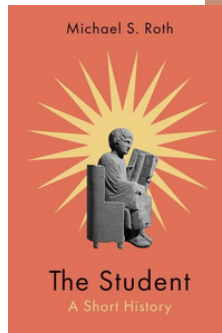
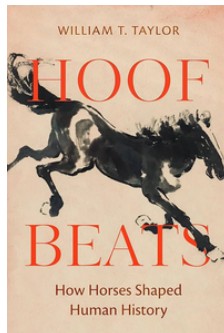
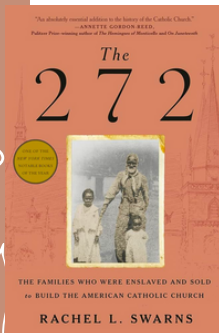

ON THIS DAY



November 21, 1953 Though Dr. Bryan Wildenthal was appointed as the fifth president of then Sul Ross State College in 1952, an official presidential inauguration was held in late November of the following year. Wildenthal, the namesake of the Bryan Wildenthal Memorial Library, served as SRSU president until his death on June 1, 1965.
